Re Miami letter to the Bureau dated 6/7/60.

Referenced letter enclosed Letterhead Memo describing a leaflet mailed from Washington, D. C., on approximately 5/16/60, from the Hubbard Communications Office, East Grinstead, Sussex, England, which reportedly regularly sends out bulletins to members of the Founding Church of Scientology in the United States. The article signed L. RON HUBBARD, attacked RICHARD M. NIXON, then campaigning for the presidency, charging that the United States Secret Service at his direct request had threatened members of the Founding Church of Washington, D. C.

[REDACTED] Florida, a white male, age [REDACTED] employed by the [REDACTED] Florida, telephonically advised he was preparing a pamphlet entitled [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] which is a direct attack on the Founding Church of Scientology operated by L. RON HUBBARD of Washington, D. C. He advised that in addition to the Bureau, he intended to forward copies of this pamphlet to the President of the United States, and various members of Congress in the near future.

[REDACTED] advised he has a deep personal interest inasmuch as his wife had become a member of this cult, resulting in the break-up of his home. He felt the principles of this cult were in opposition to Democratic principles, and are Communistic in nature. & APPROX. /

Miami indices reflect that [REDACTED] then residing at [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contacted the Miami Office, 6/21/60, to advise that his wife, [REDACTED] years of age, had been victimized by the proponents of the Founding Church of Scientology. [REDACTED] advised he has three children and his mother-in-law, [REDACTED] Florida, had been instrumental in causing his wife to become victimized by the so called auditors of Scientology.

& APPROX. 7/31/ [REDACTED] further stated that [REDACTED] Florida, age approximately [REDACTED] met his wife two years ago, and since that time his wife had been visiting [REDACTED] two nights a week to be audited by [REDACTED] regarding Scientology. It was [REDACTED] belief that this was some type of racket and that it was necessary for a person to pay a fee for each visit they had with a Scientologist such as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] further stated that he had instituted court action in the juvenile court to have his three children returned to him from his wife in view of her association with the cult of Scientology.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

In a city near here there is a man who calls himself a scientologist. Someone near to me visits this man regularly for therapy called "processing". I feel this relative is being duped and deceived by this man. He makes statements and distributes literature that contains statements which I feel are not true but I am not in a position to spend the time and money to verify my belief.

In instance, he says the Federal Bureau of Investigation agents are trained in Washington by scientologists.

In a book called "Sanity for the Layman" by Raymond Brown it appears this paragraph on page 11. "In fact, the only mental therapy that is vrot in the Un American Activities and F. B. I. lists as a danger to Society is that

under the heading of Scientology or its companion, Dianetics. These methodology and exact studies of the area of man known as "the understanding of the Human Mind and Spirit" were the only ones that sustained a clean bill of health after investigation into its practices, methods and results.

Mr. Hoover, everyone knows the fine reputation of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Its integrity and freedom from politics and scandal sets it high above all other bureaus of government. It seems to me that this man, by these statements and literature, is using the fine reputation of the F. B. I. to advance his work, Scientology, and to give people the impression that Scientology is used and approved by the F. B. I.
