Following the entry of the offices of the Assistant Guardian, Fourth Floor, Founding Church of Scientology, 2125 S Street, N.W., Washington, D. C. (WDC) by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), individuals who identified themselves as [redacted] and [redacted] appeared at the doorway to the offices of the Assistant Guardian.

[redacted] displayed a ring of keys to [redacted] at which point both entered into a discussion on whether or not they should open the locks in the Assistant Guardian's offices for the FBI rather than having the FBI break open the locks.

[redacted] then stated "maybe we ought to let them break the doors down." At this point both [redacted] and [redacted] entered into a conversation with a white male seated in a wheel chair. This also took place just outside the doorway to the offices of the Assistant Guardian. None of this latter conversation was overheard.

SCHUELKE, III, Room 3136 C, USDC, WDC. The evidence consisted of one box of original and four Xerox copies of stolen government documents, two boxes of the original copies of the remaining documents and six boxes containing four Xerox copies of the remaining documents.
